

Cold Ash 'Wildlife Allotment Garden' – the catalyst for change



A 7.4-acre site in the centre of Cold Ash village

Owned by a charitable trust – Parish councillors are the trustees

By 2019 it had become little more than a cut-through and some allotments

Dominated by invasive species (Himalayan Balsam) and dead wood

Many paths were unwalkable

Half of the site was inaccessible

Focusing on the Climate Change agenda

Realising the need to establish a purpose for the site, and the work of the volunteers, we aligned it to the Climate Agenda:

- Fully supporting Biodiversity in the area
- Making it a great place for people to enjoy the countryside, get exercise and rest
- Developing a rural feel through the introduction of livestock

The project focussed on the mental and physical wellbeing of parishioners and the health and wellbeing of the flora and fauna that make the site it's home

WHAT HAS BEEN ACHIEVED

Tidied up the site

Removed barbed wire


Cleared invasive species

Cleared fallen trees and managed dead wood

Repaired and replaced fencing

Worked to maintain and improve nearby footpaths

Cleared the watercourse



Improvements for wildlife

WHAT HAS BEEN ACHIEVED

Put up bird boxes, bug hotels and stag beetle loggeries

Restored meadows and seeded wildflowers

Cleared for biodiversity

Planted trees and hedges

Maintained the watercourse through the introduction of 'leaky dams'
